

Impact of Pupil Premium 2012- 2015

2012/2013

The school received a total of a total of £81,600. The gap between the number of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium achieving 5 or more GCSE's at grade A*-C and those not eligible was 19% (an improvement on the gap in 2012). The gap nationally was 27%. The capped and total APS (average point score) at GCSE was significantly above the national average.

2013/2014

The school received a total of £27,000. Examination results for 2014 (30 students) resulted in 55% achieving 5 A* - C including English and Mathematics with a gap of 27%. The expected three levels of progress was made by 63% of pupils in mathematics and 61% of pupils in English. More than expected progress was made by 41% of pupils in mathematics and 29% of pupils in English. Non PP pupils nationally achieved 64% and PP pupils 36.5% for 5 A* - C including English and Maths.

2014/2015

Examination results for 2015 (23 students) resulted in 39% achieving 5A* - C including English and Maths with a gap of 42%. The expected three levels of progress was made by 39% of pupils in mathematics and 52% of pupils in English. More than expected progress was made by 13% of pupils in mathematics and 17% of pupils in English.
