Pedal note

In music, a pedal point (also pedal tone, pedal note, organ point, or pedal) is a sustained tone, typically in the bass, during which at least one dissonant harmony (chord) is played in the other parts.

When a pedal point occurs in a voice or part other than the bass, it is called an inverted pedal point. Pedal points are usually on either the tonic or the dominant (fifth note of the scale) tones.
